A few subcommittee members have been facilitating a CIT currently engaged in building a district clearinghouse of current articles, literatures, studies and reports related to building cultural competence. Schoology is one platform currently being developed as a vehicle for warehousing and sharing resources.

Open Choice - The Open Choice Book Clubs are working facilitators from CREC will work with the facilitator to build capacity to lead the coordination of the implementation of the book clubs' plan for engaging parents, through the lens of equity. The elementary level book club examined school and district demographic data. Dave Barrieau developed a short Family Outreach Priorities survey to guide the groups' direction. The group has started collecting info and samples of school-to-family outreach strategies in use by schools. Amy Yarbrough reported that the group is currently working on a common definition of 'Parent Engagement'.

Parent Engagement-Wolcott has planned a second school event at Hillcrest Avenue Neighborhood Center (HANOC). An evening of food and conversation is scheduled for Thr. 2/2 5:45 - 7:15. Will offer opportunity for parents and Wolcott staff to spend time together, share ideas and engage in discussion. The evening will offer free childcare and translators as needed.

Review potential WHPS Policies for future study

Roszena reviewed the EDC purpose and priorities:

To support and sustain a diverse educational community that is inclusive and equitable by examining, developing, and improving systemic practices, programs, and policies

- Increase educator capacity for cultural proficiency in all areas of teaching and learning

- •Engage families in the work of the EDC
- -Roszena distributed a set of Board Policies most relevant to issues raised around equity, diversity, access and opportunities. Subcommittees will receive further guidance on selecting a policy most applicable to their goals and intended outcomes as a framework for driving their work.
 -Roszena also distributed the Six Thinking Hats handout and will further examine with the EDC and subcommittees how it can be used as a tool for considering recommendations for systemic change.
